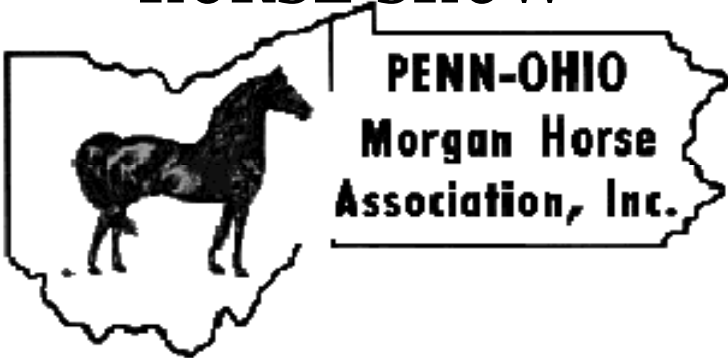

Junior Exhibitors will want to make special note of the added money in their division. **\$500** in prizes will be given to exhibitors entered in the junior exhibitor division (this does not include equitation). Also there is another **\$800** to be given by random drawing in selected open championships. Make sure your Penn Ohio membership is up to date so that you can be eligible for this money. We also have the three year old sweepstakes classes in the schedule.

Friday of the horse show will be "pink day" to promote the riding of show horses to help fund a cure for breast cancer. You can donate money in the office which will be forwarded to UPHA for the Susan G. Komen Foundation. As we all know of someone who has been afflicted by the disease, we as exhibitors and spectators can do our part to help by donating for this class. RULES AND INFORMATION

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

- EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THOSE RULES.
- Management reserves the right to change or alter the officials listed without notice prior to or during the show.
- Copies of current USEF membership cards MUST be presented with entries before numbers are issued.

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION MEMBERSHIP RULE

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular competitions, Eventing competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions, 8) Opportunity classes. 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

AMATEUR

An amateur is any exhibitor who cannot be defined as a professional. All amateur certifications must be renewed for the current year. Every rider or driver who has reached his/her 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs must possess an amateur certification issued by USEF. A copy of this card must accompany each entry.

AMATEUR OWNED/TRAINED/SHOWN CLASSES

Horses entered in Amateur Owner classes must be registered in the name of the competitor or a member of the competitor's family, as defined by rule MO104.9. (Horses registered in a farm/ranch/syndicate/partnership/corporation name may be shown in Amateur Owner classes provided the family is the sole owner of the farm or entity as defined by GR122). The sale of a horse does not eliminate this registration requirement. (Contract of Sale or Bill of Sale will not be accepted.) In the case of a junior exhibitor, the parent or guardian must sign.

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

Horses will be officially admitted to the grounds at 8:00 a.m., Wednesday, June 30, 2010. If earlier arrival is necessary, contact Stabling Manager.

CAMPERS

ALL campers must have a camper pass displayed in their window. Passes are \$25.00/day for the duration of the show regardless of hookup and can be purchased in the show secretary's office.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

Horses must be shown in qualifying classes in order to show back in the championships and must enter one (1) hour before the session starts.

CLASS SPONSORSHIPS

Class sponsorships are available at the following levels: In Hand - \$25., Performance Class - \$35. Silver Sponsor - \$50, Championship Ribbons - \$40, Championship Trophy - \$40, Championship - Ribbons and Trophy - \$80, Gold Sponsor - \$100. This money may be sent with your entries. See the class sponsor form for details.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Exhibitors are warned that any action of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials, on the part of the owner, rider or driver, will disqualify the horse. Exhibitors will be held fully responsible for any damage or discourtesy caused but their employees or guests. The management reserves to itself the right to remove any groom, horse, owner, rider or driver from the show, without being liable for compensation. No exhibitor shall approach a judge with regard to a decision unless he or she first obtains permission from the steward who shall arrange an appointment with the judge at an appropriate time and place and under no circumstances, while any session of the show is in progress. All riders, drivers and attendants must be appropriately dressed in all classes.

CROSS ENTRIES

Cross entries will be accepted in any class as long as USEF shoeing regulations are followed. No cross entering in the sweepstakes section.

DOGS

All dogs must be on a leash. The show management will enforce the order and we ask you to cooperate.

DRUGS AND MEDICATIONS

To provide funds for research, inspection and enforcement of rules regarding medications and drugs, each recognized show must assess the exhibitor a fee of \$15.00 (which includes the \$7 Drug and Medications fee and the \$8 Competition Fee) for each horse entered in the show. Although the drug rule attempts to accommodate the treatment of illness or injury, it does not accommodate the use of forbidden therapeutic medications for non-therapeutic reasons (for clipping or shipping), nor does it accommodate the use of forbidden non-therapeutic medications (such as Ritalin or Caffeine) for any reasons.

MOTOR VEHICLE STATEMENT

CR1301.7 Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf

carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s) and /or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

HOLDS

ALL REQUESTS FOR HOLDS MUST BE MADE TO THE SHOW OFFICE PRIOR TO THE START OF THE SESSION AND IF APPROVED, SAID HOLD WILL NOT BE CANCELLED.

HEADERS

All headers must be a minimum of 16 years of age.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Horses twelve months of age or more, shall be accompanied by a negative equine infectious anemia test (coggins) conducted by a laboratory approved by the USDA. Also, a current certificate of veterinary inspection within 30 days of show date must be presented for each horse.

HORSE REGISTRATION

Horses shown at this show must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Assoc., Inc., or the Canadian Morgan Horse Association, or the British Morgan Horse Society and must be entered under their full registered name or if under one year of age be eligible for registration. Horses must be entered under the names of the owner(s) or lessee of record with AMHA, CMHA, or BMHS. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof lease must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry.

HOSPITALITY

Start each day off with a smile, cup of coffee or tea and a donut. Each morning, Thursday through Sunday, from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m., the hospitality area will be open for your pleasure. It is located in the exhibit building.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR, YOUTH, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN

A Junior Exhibitor is age 17 and under. A Youth is age 21 and under. All Ladies and Gentlemen classes are limited to exhibitors 18 years of age and over. Ages as of December 1, 2009.

JUNIOR HORSE

A junior horse is defined as four years old and under as of January 1.

JUDGING ASSIGNMENTS

Management reserves the right to make changes in judging assignments should circumstances require.

LIABILITY LIMITATIONS

The Show Committee will not be responsible for any accident which may occur to any rider, driver, owner, groom or attendant, animal or equipment at the show.

Nor will the Show committee be responsible for loss or destruction of any property or equipment or damages to or by any animals on exhibition at the show, grounds, or stabling area.

MEASUREMENT OF FEET

The management reserves the right to measure feet before any protests are filed where the length of toe is a requirement. All Champions and Reserve champions must have one foot measured immediately upon leaving the ring. All Sweepstakes entries will be measured.

NOVICE HORSES

Novice horse classes are open to horses that have not won 3 blue ribbons at USEF "A" rated Morgan shows.

NOVICE RIDER

Novice rider classes are open to exhibitors that have not won 3 blue ribbons at USEF "A" rated Morgan shows.

POST ENTRIES and SCRATCHES

June 7, 2010 is the closing date for entries. Post entries may be made at \$10.00 additional charge PER HORSE. ALL POST ENTRIES FOR ANY CLASS WILL CLOSE ONE (1) HOUR PRIOR TO THE START OF THE FIRST CLASS OF THE SESSION IN WHICH THE CLASS IS TO BE SHOWN. ANY CHANGE OF ENTRY WILL BE HANDLED AS A POST ENTRY. PLEASE NOTE SHOW OFFICE HOURS AS POSTED. Entry fees for scratched classes cannot be transferred or refunded. Please be sure you are entering the correct class.

PRIZE MONEY

Prize money will be mailed within 30 days of completion of show.

REFUNDS

Only those exhibitors canceling entries in writing by registered mail prior to closing date of entries shall be entitled to have all fees returned less a \$20.00 office fee. Exhibitors with extraordinary circumstances must be addressed to the Show Chairperson.

Horses withdrawn from a class without a certificate from the official horse show veterinarian after arrival on the grounds will forfeit their fees. This certificate must be on file with the Secretary of the show no later than the day the class is scheduled. STALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE.

RING PROCEDURE AND CONDUCT

- In class that horses compete collectively, entries will be allowed a maximum of two (2) minutes to enter the ring from the time which the first horse enters the ring. A starting order will be established in classes which horses compete when the card is handed to the ringmaster or announcer.
- All riders, drivers, and attendants must be appropriately dressed in all classes.
- No loud and boisterous actions will be tolerated at ringside.

SETTLEMENT OF ACCOUNTS

- All Entries must be accompanied with a check or money order made payable to Penn Ohio Morgan Horse Association, Inc. and mailed to the Show Secretary. All fees are stated in US Currency.
- Any exhibitor with an open account must settle the account or leave an open check to be closed at the conclusion of the show. Back numbers will not be issued until this requirement and all other USEF requirements regarding signatures are met.
- All checks returned for insufficient funds will be charged a \$50.00 handling fee and must be replaced by a certified or cashier's check. No one will be allowed to show if he/she has a returned check or handling fee outstanding.

SHARPS

Safe and proper sharps disposal (needles, syringes, and other hazardous objects and materials) is the responsibility of individual exhibitors and stables. Containers are available throughout the stabling area.

SHOW RING FOOTING

Footing in the show ring and warm up areas is dirt/sand and ring size is approximately 90' x 200'.

SHOW SECRETARY

The Show Secretary's office is located at ringside. Please note office hours as posted.

STABLING

Horse and tack stalls are \$65.00. Shed row slatted front stalls are \$45.00 and are available on a first come basis due to the limited number. * Do **NOT** Split stall fees among customers on entry blanks. * NOTE: Many of our stalls are slatted, not solid. Exhibitors are advised to bring with them any materials such as plywood, stall guards, etc., they may need for animals that may be unsettled in strange surroundings. Stall doors will be provided. The show and ultimately, the exhibitor, will be charged for any and all damage to the stalls. Exhibitors who do not require stabling may show out of vans or trailers at a charge of \$20.00 per day per horse. Stalls are issued to exhibitors at the discretion of the Stabling Manager. No bedding is provided. A vendor will be present at the show.

SWEEPSTAKES

According to USEF rules, the Sweepstakes classes qualify a horse for the championships.

TRAINER/CLIENT NOTE

ALL CLIENTS OF A TRAINER MUST MAIL THEIR ENTRIES TOGETHER AND HAVE A CHECK INCLUDED. IT IS THE TRAINER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO BE SURE YOU HAVE INCLUDED THESE WITH YOUR CLIENT'S ENTRIES. DO NOT ASK THEM TO SEND A CHECK SEPARATELY. A CHECK MUST BE INCLUDED WITH THE ENTRIES.

USEF MEMBERSHIP FEE

All participants (rider, driver, handler, owner, trainer, agent or lessee) must present to the competition secretary a current USEF membership card or copy thereof. In the event a participant does not have his/her card or copy, he/she must sign an affidavit and pay a \$5.00 fee; or if not a member pay the \$25 non member fee.

****DIRECTIONS FROM NORTH****

Exit I-79 at Saegertown Exit 154(#37). Turn east onto Rt. 198. Follow into Saegertown. At the stop sign, turn right and continue on Rt. 198 through town. Rt. 198 will turn left by the grocery store. Continue on Rt. 198 to the next stop sign. Turn right onto Route 86(south). Follow 86 for just over 2 miles. After you pass the TV Repair store and the church on the right, Leslie Road will be to your left. Turn left and follow Leslie Road to the fairgrounds. Enter at Gate 3.

From the Meadville Exit

From I-79 - take Exit 147A - Meadville - Follow Rt. 322 East. Go straight towards Downtown Meadville over Smock Bridge and then exit straight onto Park Avenue. Go to ninth traffic light and turn right onto Randolph Street. At the next light, turn left onto North Main Street. Follow N. Main to the Y and bear to the right - up the hill - past Allegheny College (about 1 mile) - turn right onto Limber Road. After 3/4 mile, turn right onto Hamilton Road. Fairgrounds entrance is 3/4 mile on the right
